Globalization, liberalization and free market are some of the most significant modern trends in an economy. Most economists in our country seem captivated by the spell of the free market. Consequently, nothing seems good or normal that does not accord with the requirements of the free market. A price that is determined by the seller or for that matter, established by anyone other than the aggregate of consumers seems pernicious.

Accordingly, it requires a major act of will to think of price-fixing as both normal and having a valuable economic function. In fact, price-fixing is normal in all industrialized societies because the industrial system itself provides, as an effortless consequence of its own development, the price-fixing that it requires. Modern industrial planning requires and rewards great size. Hence a comparatively small number of large firms will be competing for the same group of consumers. That each large firm will act with consideration of its own needs and thus avoid selling its products for more than its competitors' price is commonly recognized by advocated of freemarket economic theories. But each firm will also act with full consideration of the needs that it has in common with the other large firms competing for the same customer. Each large firm thus avoid significant stable price cutting, because price-cutting will be prejudicial to the common interest in a stable demand for products.

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Socialists industry also works within a framework of controlled prices. In early 1970s the Soviet Union began to give firms and industries some flexibility in adjusting prices that a more informal evolution has accorded the capitalist system. Economists in the USA have hailed the change as a return to the free market. But the Soviet firms were not in favor of the price established by a freemarket over which they exercised little influence; rather, Soviet firms acquired some power to fix prices.

Traditional Indian values must be viewed both from the angle of the individual and from that of the geographically delimited agglomeration of peoples or groups enjoying a common system of leadership which we call the 'state'. The Indian state's special feature is the peaceful or perhaps mostly peaceful co-existent of social groups of various historical provenances which mutually adhere in a geographical, economic and political sense, without ever assimilating to each other in social terms, in ways of thinking or ever in language. Modern Indian law will determine certain rules especially in relation to the regime of the family, upon the basis of how the lion-cloth is tied or how the turban is worn, for this may identify the litigants as members of a rational group and therefore as participants in its traditional law, though their ancestors left the region three or four centuries earlier.

The use of the word 'State' above must not mislead us. There was no such thing as a conflict between the individual and the state at least before Foreign Governments became established, just as there was no concept of state sovereignty or of any church and state dichotomy. Modern Indian Secularism has an admittedly peculiar feature: It requires the state to make a fair distribution of attention and support amongst all religions.

These blessed aspects of India's famed tolerance (Indian kings so rarely persecuted religiously groups that the exceptions prove the rule) at once struck Portuguese and other European visitors to the West Coast of India in 16th century and the impression made upon them in this and other ways gave rise, at one remove to the basic Constitution of Thomas Mores' Utopia. There is little about modern India that strikes one at once as Utopian but the insistence upon the inculcation of norms and the absence of bigotry and institutionalized exploitation of human or natural resources are two very different features which link the realities of India and her tradition with the essence of all Utopians.
