France's dominance over International fashion began in early 18th century.

Until Industrial Revolution, people belonged to two main classes: wealthy and poor. Only the wealthy could afford fashionable clothes. By the turn of 18th century, King Louis XIV's court members became the trendsetters of taste, making Paris the fashion capital of Europe. Many of the French cities were supplying the court with silk fabrics, ribbons and laces. At this time intricate seaming of fashion required painstaking hand sewing. All the clothes were hand made and custom made i.e. made to fit the customer's exact measurements.

France became the centre of fashion due to support from the royal court and the development of the silk industry there. Couture (koo-tour') was the term used for the art of dress making. A male designer was a couturier and his female counterpart was couturiere.

The Industrial Revolution marked the beginning of technological advances in textile and apparel production. Due to the developments more fabrics were produced in less time. During this time spinning jenny and power looms were invented. This gave rise to development of American textile industry. Rapidly increasing trade and industry in return created a middle class with money to spend on the luxuries of life, including better clothing.

Issac Singer invented the foot treadle machine which facilitated faster produces. Levis Strauss in 1849 used fabrics intended for tents, wagon covers to make long wearing pants with pockets for tools which later became popular as denims clothes specially made for labourers.

All children are vulnerable, but some are more vulnerable than others. These are the children who are living in such challenging conditions and difficult circumstances that their basic needs of food, health, care and nurturance are not met and this prevents them from developing their full potential. For these children, 13-18 years in State Custody, Government run homes are present. Information (given below) clearly highlights that the needs of a large proportion of child population are not met.

- Nearly two-thirds of children under five years of age suffer from moderate or severe malnutrition. Malnutrition affects development in all areas.
- About 3 million children live on the streets without any shelter.
- Only one in three children of the pre-school age has the opportunity to be in an early learning programme.
- Less than half of India's children between 6 and 14 years go to school.
- A little over one-third of all children who enroll in Standard I reach Standard VIII. The others drop out of school for one or the other reason.
- 17 million children in India work, as per official estimates. The actual numbers may be even more. According to the World Bank the number may be 44 million.
- Malnutrition is also seen in the form of obesity
