On 25 June 1975, the government declared that there was a threat of internal disturbances and therefore, it involved Article 352 of the Constitution. The Prime Minister recommended the imposition of Emergency to president Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed. He issued the proclamation immediately.

Once an emergency is proclaimed, the federal distributions of powers remains partially suspended and all the powers are concentrated in the hands of the Union Government. Secondly the government also gets the power to curtail or restrict all or any of the Fundamentals Rights during the emergency. From the wording of the provisions of the Constitution. It is clear that an emergency is seen as an extra ordinary condition in which normal democratic politics cannot function. Therefore, special powers are granted to the government.
